Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

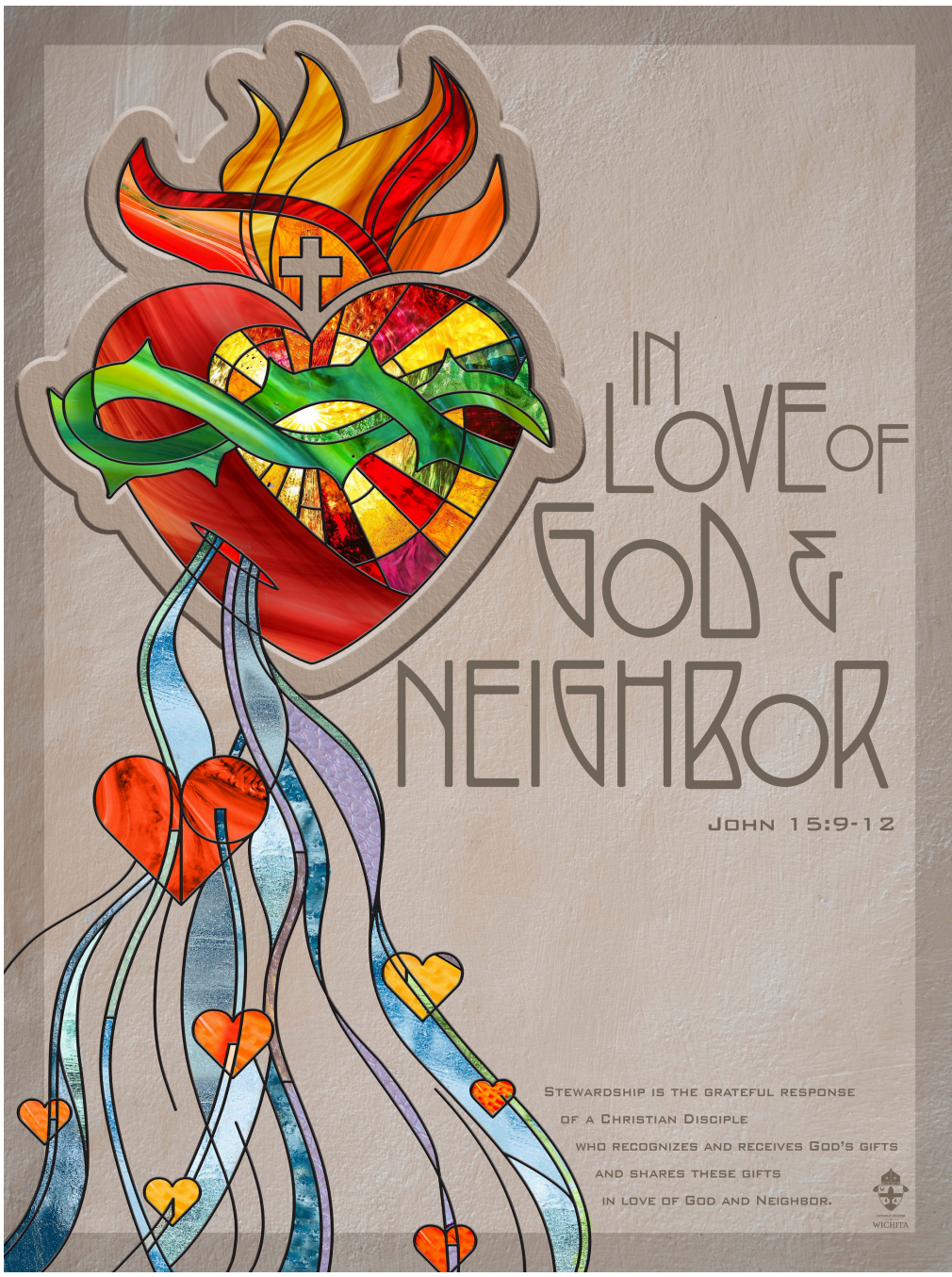

Precious Blood Devotion




